Owners close Milford Herald News after 124 years of ink

MILFORD—The oldest business here—and the one that kept residents informed of local happenings-has closed.

The Milford Herald News suspended publication with last week's edition, said owner Shirley Hallock.

Hallock and her husband, John, purchased the newspaper in 1990. It was in its 124th year of business. "It's the oldest business in this town," Hallock said.

The decision to discontinue printing the paper was made for a combination of personal and business reasons. Mr. Hallock suffers from Parkinson's disease and was unable to continue working while Mrs. Hallock works at the Citizens State Bank. Three employees were hired to run the newspaper but declining circulation and ad sales made for a tight economic situation. "We couldn't seem to make (the money) stretch far enough," Hallock said.

The decision to cease printing was a difficult one. "I do hate it because I now people in the community will miss it," she said. "I'm in hopes that somebody can and will take it over."

Halllock hopes to sell the paper, which printed approximately 1,000 copies each week.



Breadwinner's early retirement can affect surviving spouse's Social Security benefits

If you are married, have been the primary wage earner in your family and are thinking about filing for early retirement, there are some things you should consider.

Most people know they can collect reduced Social Security retirement benefits as early as age 62. However, most people don't



know that collecting Social Security before their full retirement age can reduce the benefit amounts paid to their survivors.

Consider the following couple: Tom was born in 1938 and has just turned 62. His wife, Shirley, has worked but Tom has been the primary wage earner. Tom is thinking about when he should start collecting Social Security.

Social Security will compute a "basic benefit" for Tom that is based on his lifetime earnings. Tom would receive 100 percent of the basic benefit at his full retirement age of 62 years and two months.

Tom's choice of when to start receiving Social Security will also affect how much of a widow's benefit Shirley will get from Social Security if Tom dies before she does.

If Tom waits until his full retirement age to collect

Social Security, Shirley's benefit will be 100 percent of Tom's basic benefit. If, however, Tom received early retirement benefits, her widow's benefit will be

According to Social Security, there are currently three million widows and widowers who have less

income because they were married to people who filed for early retirement benefits.

A representative at your local Social Security office can talk with you and your spouse about your specific situation. When you are fully informed, you can make the decision that is right for both you and your family.
