Hoopeston Area schools get \$60,000 technology grant

The Hoopeston Area schools technology department will get a boost this year with a \$60,000 Technology Literacy Challenge Fund grant.

The technology grant will involve teams of teachers in grades five through 10 with a focus on reading and math. Part of the grant will be used for equipment and part will be used for teaching and instructor training, said Superintendent Mark Conolly.

Hoopeston Area schools will work with Argonne National Laboratories and the University of Illinois on interactive county maps and Fermilab in Batavia to develop on-line student projects and training in using the on-line engaged learning course provided by the lab.

Hoopeston Area's portion of the grant was written by Lori Eells in collaboration with the Carrollton and Massac school districts.

In unrelated business, the board set 7:30 p.m. Sept. 21 as the hearing date for the tentative 2000-01 budget.

The tentative budget is "exactly \$100,000 more than last year," at \$9,488,132, Conolly said.

The budget is on display at Conolly's office for public viewing.

In other action, the board:

- approved resignations from Chanel Rentfrow, high school computer applications/business teacher; Jane Bray, assistant high school girls basketball coach; and Molly Cropper, Maple music teacher/teacher aide.
- hired Deborah Ledford, high school computer applications/business teacher; Ann Penicook, middle school English, assistant student services; Jimmy Chism, high school custodian; Philip Morris and Pam Patterson, Maple classroom aides; Kathy Neal, food service—satellite; Tricia Schieler, seventh grade girls basketball coach; and Jim Wisdom, assistant varsity boys basketball coach.
- heard concerns from Mark Wagoner about the proposed soccer field behind the high school. Wagoner questioned why a Bismarck firm was used to level the field and why the project was not let for bids when any of several in-district companies could have been used to complete the project.

Board member Duane Sheppard said Silver Brothers Construction was hired for the work and subcontracted

Board president Larry Lobb said the work, estimated at \$30,000, was done in stages and did not meet the state law requiring bids for projects over \$10,000.
