# **Dad's Place**

**Country Bar & Grill** 3 miles west of Milford at Bryce



DANVILLE-Police are still investigating why a Tilton man drove his vehicle into the Public Safety Building Wednesday and started shooting.

Stanley G. Shank, 59, was killed when Danville Police officers returned fire, said Gary Miller, Vermilion County Sheriff's Department Chief Investigator.

The shooting occurred at approximately 12:35 p.m. Wednesday when Shank drove a Jeep Grand Cherokee up the front steps and through bulletproof glass doors. Shank got out of the Jeep and fired a single shot from a handgun. Officers, who heard the Jeep breaking the doors, came to the lobby and returned fire, Miller said.

Shank was pronounced dead at 1:05 p.m. at Provena United Samaritans Medical Center. The preliminary cause of death was listed as multiple gunshot wounds; Miller said the report from the initial autopsy was expected Thursday afternoon. An inquest will be sched-

uled at a later date.

Neither the officers nor two people in the lobby were hurt in the exchange, Miller said, adding that the fact there were so few people in the lobby was "lucky. Usually at that time of day, it's very busy," he said.

The sheriff's department is conducting "a real intensive investigation ... into the background of the suspect," Miller said. Shank's family, neighbors and friends are being questioned to determine a motive for the shooting. Reports from the interviews are expected to be given to Sheriff Pat Hartshorn tomorrow.

Asked if the incident was "suicide by police," a phenomenon in which a suspect forces officers to shoot him, Miller said "I'm certainly not ready to say that."

Police towed Shank's vehicle from the scene for further investigation. A second gun was found in the Jeep, according to reports.


