Hoopeston Area eyes six to eleven cent tax rate increase

Taxpayers in the Hoopeston Area school district will see a tax increase next year that could range from six to eight cents.

At Thursday's board meeting, the board passed a tentative tax levy of 11.5 percent. The amount is a high estimate, said Don Dean, who oversees the district finances.

The levy, to be received in 2001, will generate a maximum of \$265,000, Dean said, adding it is more likely the district will take in \$188,000. Of that, the net total of property tax and state aid will only mean an increase of \$77,000 because of decreased state aid, he said.

District officials will not know the equalized assessed valuation until March so Dean developed three scenarios: a worst-case, in which taxes will raise by 11 cents, equaling \$22 on a \$60,000 home; a best-case, with a sixcent increase, or \$12 on the same home; or the probable scenario, an eight-cent increase with a tax rate of \$3.57 and a \$16 increase on a \$60,000 home.

The tax rate will still be 15 to 40 percent less than any district in Vermilion County, Dean said.
