At Monday's regular meeting, trustees approved holding a reconvened session at 7 p.m. Thursday to vote on instituting a property tax of 25 cents per \$100 assessed valuation.

The tax is expected to generate \$18,700 annually and add about \$41 to the tax bill on a \$60,000 home. The money is earmarked for village payments to the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund.

In other action Monday, the board approved vacation time and personal days for full time employees.

Employees will receive five days after the first year. Employees with two to 10 years' service will get 10 days; 11-19 years, 15 days; and more than 20

Early dismissal


Hoopeston Area schools will dismiss early Thursday for the start of Christmas vacation.

From Brandon, I have learned much about your small community and your way of life in Illinois. I have come to understand, through Brandon's excellent ambassadorship, that cultural stereotyping is not a very accurate way to view the world and that tolerance is the way to go.

My first impression of Hoopeston was my idea of how Oklahoma should look. I was always tempted to burst into "There's A Bright Golden Haze on the Meadow" when I saw the fields of sweet corn. Roleystone has no claim to fame like Hoopeston being the "Corn Capitol of the World" and home of the Cornjerkeers.

Roleystone, where I live, is a small community in the hills overlooking Perth, West Australia. It has about the same population as Hoopeston. It is surrounded by what is called in Australia "The Bush." This "bush" is literally hundreds of thousands of densely timber-covered acres. You would probably call it a forest.
