Man, dog team up for police work in Vermilion County

If a dog is man's best friend, Deputy Jerry Christian of the Vermilion County Sheriff's Department has a friend for life.

Christian showed the skills of his 2½-year-old Rott-weiler, Zoe, at Monday's Hoopeston Neighborhood Watch meeting. Zoe and Christian are part of the sheriff's department canine unit.

Zoe is trained in using articles to search for people; drug locating, including marijuana, cocaine and heroin; and aggression. She is a third generation police dog, Christian said. Her grandmother is a retired Vermilion County dog and her mother is still working in Tilton.

Christian said he volunteered to become part of the canine unit. "I enjoy working with dogs, always have," he said. He paid for Zoe and for her training, not an inexpensive proposition since the Danville Police Department recently paid \$14,000 for a trained dog.

Christian, a six-year deputy, predominantly uses hand signals with Zoe when he commands her to sit, heel or search for drugs. The dog, still a puppy at heart, enjoys her work and gets excited when she hears Christian say "check" to look for drugs.

Zoe belies the Rottweiler's reputation as a mean breed. "She's not a mean dog outside of the car," he said. She

has only bitten one person in the line of duty and is very loyal. "I'd trust her with my life," Christian said.

In fact, Zoe lives with Christian and his family and is a pet to his children. "You should see what they do to her," he said.

Although Zoe is not mean-tempered, she is very protective, not only of Christian but his family, as well. "I pity the person who tries to mess with my family," he said.
