12-year incumbent, current clerk square off in city election

Editor's note: In today's edition, Just the Facts begins a series on candidates in the April 3 election. Information for the series was gathered from questionnaires sent to each candidate. Hoopeston mayoral candidates are featured today.

A man with 12 years' experience and a relative newcomer to politics each wants to be Hoopeston's mayor.

Bob Ault, serving his third term as mayor, and Chalmers Flint are running for a four-year term as mayor.

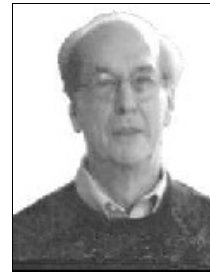
Flint, 62, has been city clerk since 1997. He also has experience as an alderman in Good Hope from 1970-74. He is currently executive director of the Hoopeston Multi Agency and was formerly principal at John Greer Grade School.

Flint said he want to be mayor to be part of the future growth of the city. "I would like the challenge of bringing in new businesses and helping the present businesses grow," he said.

The biggest issues facing the community include unemployment, housing for management, the odor problem and the need for city residents to know what is going on with city government, he said.

To solve those problems, Flint said he would not only

work with the employment office but also contact local employers to see if and how the city can help them bring in additional work. As for housing, with the TIF district in place, infrastructure needs to be placed where local contractors can begin building homes for upper management. Flint said he would stay in contact with county and state government to update laws, look for extra financial support and network with others to bring business and industry to Hoopeston.



ence as a full-time mayor and an ability to communicate with all people as assets he brings to the office. He said he will continue to work for a balanced budget and to promote growth for the city.

Balancing the budget with the present income is a prime consideration for Ault, as is developing infrastructure for new housing, working with existing industry and involvement with state and county government to keep abreast of new projects. He said he will also work with new companies looking to expand in Hoopeston.

Ault said he is interested in doing what he can do for the city rather than what he can receive. He cited his stability in the community and workplace, with more than 35 years at American National Can and serving on various community boards as part of his platform.
