HA high, middle school to share principal in 2001-02

Hoopeston Area High School and Middle School will share one principal next year.

The district school board on Thursday approved hiring middle school principal Hank Hornbeck as principal of both buildings.

He replaces Doyle Owen who submitted his resignation last month, citing personal reasons for leaving.

Board president Larry Lobb said declining enrollment is the main reason to combine the positions. Five or six years ago, the high school had close to 600 students. Now the combined high school/middle school have slightly more than that, he said.

Although lower enrollment is a factor, so, too, is Hornbeck. "(The board) thought we had almost the perfect individual for the job," Lobb said. "He relates really well to the teachers. He relates really well to the kids."

Hornbeck began his career at Hoopeston Area High

School, serving as physical education teacher for two years before being named dean of students, where he served another two years. He has been middle school principal for three years.

The change is expected to have effects on two fronts, monetary and continuity.

Although Hornbeck will receive a raise for overseeing both schools and a dean of students will be hired at the middle school, the increase and new salary will be less than what the district would spend on a new high school principal, Lobb said.

Additionally, with Hornbeck at the helm of both builidngs, Lobb expects continuity to improve. The high school has lost two principals in three years and rather than go outside the district for a principal, the board decided to promote Hornbeck, known to teachers in both

Carnival worker bill passes House, goes to state senate

SPRINGFIELD—A bill designed to provide vital information on carnival workers to cities where they work has passed its first hurdle.

Last week the Illinois House unanimously approved House Bill 60, suggested by Hoopeston Police Chief Mark Drollinger.

The bill, which passed with an amendment exempting Chicago, would require carnival managers to provide the names, birth dates and Social Security numbers of employees or subcontractors expected to be on site for the carnival. Fair boards or corporate authorities must provide a copy of the information to local law enforcement agencies.

Drollinger is "very pleased" that his suggestion, which received the support of Rep. Bill Black (R-Danville) has been successful thus far. "This will fill a void where

other laws, such as the sex offender laws, fall short," he said. "It only makes sense that a law for transient workers who have direct access to our children be passed when there are other laws that address people who put seal coats on driveways or paint barns have to provide the same information."

Drollinger said his proposal has been criticized by one person "who claims that the bill is too intrusive. This came from a former school employee who had little or no contact with children, yet they had to go through a more stringent background check than I am proposing."

The bill has one more step before it can be placed on Gov. George Ryan's desk: the state senate. "I hope Senator (Judy) Myers will now pick up sponsorship and carry the ball through the Senate," Drollinger said.

Serving as principal of both schools will be "a big challenge...but I'm looking forward to it," Hornbeck said. He, too, expects improved continuity having one leader over both buildings. "Each school is doing great things," he said. "This will help make it better."

Hornbeck said the dual principal role will work because of the staff in each building. "They're professional and they work together," he said.

Lobb is confident the plan will work both because of the physical structure of the high/middle school and because of Hornbeck. "We thought about this a few years ago but didn't have the right individual," he said. Now, "it seemed like a logical choice. This is the perfect time to try it."
