Attorney General's office combats cybercrime on local level

The Illinois Attorney General's office isn't taking high tech crime lightly.

The office has established a Regional Computer Crimes Enforcement Group (RCCEG) that includes Vermilion County and Hoopeston police representatives, said Patrice Manning, staff assistant of the Attorney General's High Tech Crimes Bureau.

Manning spoke at Monday's Hoopeston Neighborhood Watch meeting.

Hoopeston is part of the Mid-State RCCEG, one of five in the state, Manning said. The group includes representatives from Vermilion, Iroquois, Champaign, DeWitt, Ford, Macon and Piatt counties.

Russell Rudd, the police department's 911 coordinator, was appointed to represent the department on the task force. Rudd is "extremely computer literate and fluent," said Chief Mark Drollinger.

Task force members undergo training which allows them to gather evidence from computer hard drives. Evidence may include such things as proof a suspect has been involved in on-line child exploitation to Internet fraud, Manning said.

Illinois is applying for federal grants to allow cities to participate in the program. Locally, the Hoopeston Po-

Carnival bill moves ahead

A bill that would require carnival workers to register in the cities they appear is making headway in the Illinois Senate.

House bill 60, suggested by Hoopeston Police Chief Mark Drollinger, is set for a final reading and debate in the near future, said Drollinger at Monday's Neighborhood Watch meeting.

The bill, which would require carnival workers to list their names, dates of birth and Social Security numbers in cities where the carnivals are, has been endorsed by the Illinois Department of Labor and the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police, Drollinger said.

One group, a lobby representing carnivals, is opposed to the measure.

The bill has already passed the Illinois House.



criminals to flourish, both because of the anonymity involved and because many crimes, such as frauds, are for small amounts which go unreported, Manning said.

Manning addressed two specific areas of high tech crime: child exploitation and fraud.

The Internet allows pedophiles to find children, gain their trust and set up meetings. "It's an abomination, quite frankly," she said.

Investigators now pose as teenagers to catch such criminals.

As for fraud, auction sites have become a haven for people who want to take advantage of others by selling misrepresented items or those who commit credit card and identity theft, she said. "They just sit in their living rooms and commit crimes all day," she said. "These people really are getting away with a lot."

Manning advised people to be careful about providing credit card and Social Security numbers over the Internet, using only reputable sites and reporting crimes. When in doubt, make a phone call," she said.


