Grimes was named one of the Illinois Jaycees' "Ten Outstanding Young People of 2001." The award is based on several criteria, including personal improvement or accomplishments, financial success/economic innovation, social improvement to majors contemporary problems, philanthropic contributions/voluntary services, scientific/technological contributions, legal reform,

cultural achievement, moral and religious leadership, athletic accomplishment and success in the influence of public opinion. Grimes' award was based on volunteerism for his work in the Jaycees and other organizations. He joined the Jaycees in 1990 and has served as president, vice president, secretary, treasurer and treasurer of the National Sweetcorn Festival for the past six years. He is also a member of the Rossville Fire Protection District Board, Rossville Planning Committee, secretary/treasurer of the Vermilion County 4-H livestock auction and was a member of the Rossville zoning board. 
Meeting set to list survey results

Results of a survey determining what residents like—and don't like—about Hoopeston will be unveiled June 18. The Visioning for the Future committee met Wednesday with Nigel Austin, PhD., Extension Educator, Community and Economic Development, University of Illinois Extension, Champaign. The extension office is working with the visioning group to develop a plan for Hoopeston's future. Results of the survey, which asked residents to rate such things as economic development, satisfaction with the community, appearance, shopping trends and barriers to improvement, will be announced to the public at 6:30 p.m. June 18. The meeting is tentatively set to be held in the Hoopeston Area High School auditorium. A total of 341 people responded to the survey, which was sent to residents in February. "We were hoping for a higher response rate," Austin said of the 12.6 percent of residents who completed and returned the questionnaire.
