Automobile dealership to sponsor children's safety program

Most parents and families are unaware of the fact that more than 2,1000 children are reported missing each day. Crown Ford Mercury aims to reduce this number and help protect Hoopeston children by hosting a "Commitment to Kids" Safety ID Day.

From 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, June 2, parents can bring their children to Crown Ford Mercury on Rt. 1 to receive free child safety ID kits. A free photograph will be taken of each child for the identification booklet and instructions will be provided for parents to complete their child's physical description information. In addition, a Hoopeston Police Department officer will be on hand to fingerprint children for the booklets.

Taking a few minutes to participate in the "Commitment to Kids" program may be the single

most important thing Hoopeston parents can do for their children this year. In the event a child is reported missing, the identification kit and fingerprints can help ensure a child's safety. Parents keep their child's completed ID kit and are urged to repeat the identification process every six months to maintain updated information.

"Commitment to Kids" is a partnership among Ford Blue Oval Certified dealers, actress Jamie Lee Curtis and the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children.
