Nancy Stipp named as Ward 3 alderperson on city council

Ward 3 residents have a new representative on the Hoopeston City Council.

Nancy Stipp was appointed Tuesday night to fill Susan Comstock's unexpired two-year term.

Mayor Chalmers Flint said he appointed Stipp because she had expressed an interest in the seat. He said he wanted to replace Comstock with another woman because voters had originally selected a woman.

Stipp said someone asked her if she would be interested in the alderperson's seat. "I thought it would be good," she said. "Rather than sit back and complain, I thought I would get involved, see how it works and why it works."

Stipp is currently bookkeeper for the Hoopeston Area school district, a position she has held since 1995. She has been employed at the district since 1986.

In other business, parks committee chairman Alder-

man Mike Eckersley is warning swimmers that those who use the pool as a potty will be prosecuted. "Anybody caught defecating in the pool will be brought up on charges, I don't care how old they are" he said. The pool was closed after two such incidents in one day, he said. The pool must be closed for 24 hours after an incident.

Residents who swim in the lagoon will also be arrested, Eckersley said.

In unrelated action, the council:

learned the city will purchase a 2001 Chevrolet Impala squad car for \$19,596 through the state bidding pool. A current squad car, a 1996 Crown Victoria, will be sold by sealed bid of not less than \$2,100.

The car has fewer than 79,000 miles and is available for viewing by calling the Hoopeston Police Department

Rossville railroad crossings to get much-needed repairs

ROSSVILLE—Long awaited railroad repairs are expected to be completed this month.

CSX Railroad will repair crossings on Attica and Benton streets on June 20 or 21 said Mayor Terry Prillaman.

The announcement was made at Monday's village board meeting.

Repairs are overdue and desperately needed, Prillaman said. "If somebody was walking across it, they could break a leg," he said, adding a picture was taken of a bicycle wheel in a hole in the crossing to give perspective to the hole's depth.

In unrelated action, Prillaman appointed a human resources committee to review applications for employment. The committee is expected to meet this week to go over applications and recommend an em-

ployee to work in all village departments.

The full board will meet in a reconvened meeting at 5 p.m. Friday to hear the committee's recommendation, Prillaman said.

In other business, trustees:

approved trustee Kay Ritter as budget officer.

learned the village will have a resource library at the village office. One copy of state statutes, the trustee handbook and other documents will be kept there to eliminate the need for multiple copies. The library is designed to be a cost-cutting measure, Prillaman said.

approved a special use permit at 410 Harrison to convert a garage into living quarters.

discussed but took no action on residents burning refuse in the village.
