New Danville company to use employees for cleanup work

Employees of a new Danville company will be cleaning up in Hoopeston Wednesday.

Approximately 16 production workers employed by Fiberteq will help city workers with tree trimming and other cleanup efforts, said Earl Fuller, plant production leader.

Fiberteq makes the fiberglass paper used in insulation. The company plant is under construction on Southgate Drive in Danville.

Employees who have already been hired are attending training sessions and doing some work inside the plant. Fiberteq is also encouraging employees to participate in community service work such as Hoopeston's cleanup effort. "We wanted a couple opportunities to reach out to the community," Fuller said, adding employees may also be taking part in Danville Habitat For Humanity.

Company approval for the cleaning effort was given by plant manager John Sowels. Human resources director Lori Blackford will be in Hoopeston to organize the volunteers.

Fiberteq learned of the volunteer opportunity from employee and Hoopeston resident Stephen Highfill. Jeff Maire, son of Price Less owner Tom Maire, also is employed by the company. "We have several people with roots in the community," Fuller said.

The company's cleanup efforts are expected to begin at 7 a.m. and last until 3:30. The group will break for lunch from 12-1 and will meet at the American Legion which is providing the noon meal for volunteers.

Fiberteq is still taking applications for warehouse and production employees. The company hopes to hire 16 to 20 more workers, Fuller said.

Hoopeston Area lists school supplies for 2001-02 year

Hoopeston Area grade schools have listed supplies students will need for the 2001-02 year. They are:

Early Childhood – 1 box 8 large crayons, 1 box tissues, 2 glue sticks, book bag big enough to hold a folder, complete change of clothes to be left at school.

Kindergarten – 1 box 8 large Crayola crayons (first semester) 1 box 16 large Crayola crayons (second semester), 2 4 oz. bottles Elmer's white glue, 2 primary pencils (large type), paint shirt or apron, supply box (cigar or similar type), 1 large box tissues, pair tennis shoes for P.E. (to be left at school, no black bottoms) 4 white glue sticks, school bag, 1 pink or green eraser, change of clothes to be kept in child's locker.

Each item should be marked with child's name, including individual crayons.

Primary Special Ed – school box, 2 boxes of 8 crayons, 4 glue sticks, 1 box markers block eraser, scissors, 1 pkg. colored pencils, 2 pocket folders, gym shoes to be left at school, paint shirt, book bag, 2 boxes tissues, change of clothes to be left at school.

First grade – 2 pocket folders, 2 70 page wide ruled spiral notebooks, 1 pkg. #2 pencils, 2 erasers, pink block rectangular type, 1 box each 8 and 16 crayons, 8 oz. bottle white paper glue, 2 glue sticks, child's scissors (metal), 1 box tissues, pencil box, paint shirt, pair gym shoes and change of clothes to be left at school, school bag.

Second grade – 4 Ross solid glue sticks, 8 oz. bottle Elmer's white paper glue, 2 pink block erasers, 1 box 24 crayons, child's scissors (Fiskars, metal blades) 2 pocket folders 1 or 2 boxes tissues, 1 pkg. long colored pencils, pencil box, gym shoes (white soles) to be left at school, paint shirt, 1 pkg. of 8 wide-tipped markers.

Third grade – 4 oz. bottle white glue, 2 glue sticks, gym shoes, paint shirt, 4 gallon size freezer zip bags, 4 solid color pocket folders, 1 box tissues, colored pencils, scissors (Fiskars preferred) pink block eraser, six #2 pencils, crayons (24 or smaller), washable markers, extra red-lead pencil.
