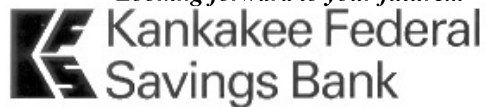

Hoopeston Area schools set registration, orientation times

Hoopeston Area schools have announced registration and orientation information for this year's students.

Registration will begin Monday for students in ninth grade. Those with last names beginning with A-L should register from 8:30-11: a.m.; M-Z from 12:30-3 p.m.

Ninth grade orientation will be at 6 p.m. Aug. 13 in the high school auditorium.

Grades seven and 10 will register Tuesday, Aug. 14. Again, students whose last names begin with A-L should register from 8:30-11 a.m.; M-Z from 12:30-3 p.m.

Seventh grade orientation will be at 6 p.m. Tuesday in the high school auditorium.

Grades 8 and 11 will register Wednesday, Aug. 15. Students will again be divided by those with last names A-L from 8:30-11 a.m. and M-Z from 1-6.

The wrecker service, located in the back of Kinnett's Welding, is a full-service operation, offering such things as jump starts, winching and recovery, tire changing, unlocks, light and heavy duty tow, 48 state authority and
