Hoopeston council approves uniform policy for employees

City employees will be more noticeable following action taken by the Hoopeston City Council Tuesday night.

The council voted 5-2 to have employees such as water and street and alley workers wear uniforms. Employees will pay \$4.25 weekly for the service, provided by Russ Uniforms, said Alderman Kevin Davis who oversaw the project.

Davis said renting uniforms will save employees from purchasing new clothing to wear to work and will save on laundry costs while allowing them to look more professional.

The city will pick up the tab for a three percent garment charge and 20 percent oversize charge so that each employee will pay the \$4.25, Davis said.

Street and alley superintendent Dave Knake, who has worn uniforms, said they often don't fit him. "I'm not willing to pay for a uniform I can't wear," he said adding neither he nor his employees favor the policy.

Aldermen Mike Eckersley and Don York voted

against the uniform proposal.

In unrelated action, the council:

- approved granting access on the parkways of Market and Penn to allow cleanup of an underground storage leak at the former gas station at 301 S. Market.

- learned poles from AmerenCIPS for two new sirens will cost the city \$2,400. Power to the sirens will be provided without charge.

- learned the city received approximately \$60,000 for storm damage to the ambulance and water buildings. Another \$190,000 is expected for damage to the water building, said Mayor Chalmers Flint. The city is considering plans for a new structure combining the fire and water departments on Main, freeing up the entire ambulance barn for the ambulance service, he said.

- received a letter from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency praising Hoopeston's water supply. "Basically what the letter states is Mr. (Steve) Baker has been doing an awesome job keeping our water supply good," Davis said.
