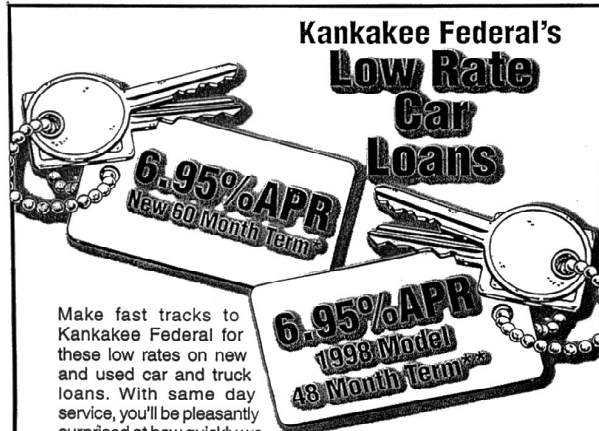

The Hoopeston Multi Agency will mark the national event with an hour-long presentation at 6 p.m. Oct. 11 at 206 S. First Ave. The evening will celebrate the agency's Teen Reach program with parents, community and school leaders and Mayor Chalmers Flint.

Teen Reach is available to children ages 9-17. The hours are 3:30-7 p.m. Monday through Friday. The program provides homework help, a meal and speakers and

programs dealing with problem areas for today's youth.

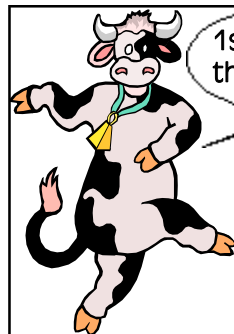
