Halloween treats available at Hoopeston sites, tips listed

Area children have several choices for fun this Halloween night.

Aside from trick-or-treating door-to-door, children may visit other places in Hoopeston to increase their treats for the night. Places offering treats include:

Ultimate Care, located next to Price Less on Market St. The site, which will offer care to troubled youth, has not started accepting children yet but owners will hand out treats Wednesday night. Cider will be available to adults accompanying children.

Children may also get treats at Hoopeston Community Nursing Home from 5-8 p.m. and Country Terrace Apartments from 5-6 p.m.

For families that don't observe Halloween, New Bethel Fellowship in Rossville will hold Hallelujah Night. Children will meet from 6:30-8:30 p.m. at the church, 201 N. Chicago. Children are asked not to come in costume.

Trick-or-treat hours in Hoopeston are 5-8 p.m. In Rossville, hours are 5:30-8 p.m. for children 12 and younger and 5-8 p.m. in Milford. Residents who have treats are asked to leave their porch lights on and children are asked to go only to those houses.

To have a fun and safe Halloween, parents are advised

to follow some safety tips for their trick-or-treaters, including:

- Plan a safe route so parents know where their older kids will be at all times. Set a time for their return home.
- Make sure that the child is old enough and responsible enough to go out by himself.
- Let your children know not to cut through back alleys and fields. Make sure they know to stay in populated, well-lighted places and not go off the beaten track.
- Stop only at familiar houses in your own neighborhood unless they are accompanied by an adult.
- Small children should never be allowed to go out alone on Halloween. Make sure an older sibling or adult is with them.
- Instruct your children not to eat any treats until they bring them home to be examined by you.
- Instruct your child to never go into the home of a stranger or get into their car.
- Make sure your child carries a flashlight, glow stick or has reflective tape on their costume to make them more visible to cars.
- Let them know that they should stay together as a group if going out to trick or treat without an adult.

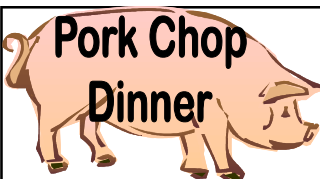
