Hoopeston Police Department to start Explorer program

A new program will give local youth hands-on experience in law enforcement.

The Hoopeston Police Department will offer an Explorer program for boys and girls ages 14-20, said police chief Mark Drollinger at Monday's Neighborhood Watch meeting.

Drollinger presented an informal program after scheduled speaker Judge Claudia Anderson was unable to attend.

An informational meeting will be held at 7 p.m. Nov. 27 at the Hoopeston city hall. Approximately 50 young people have been invited to the meeting, which is open to others with an interest in law enforcement, Drollinger said.

Explorer programs follow guidelines of the Boy Scouts of America and focus on a particular area of interest, such as law enforcement, fire protection and high See EXPLORER on other side

Work nears completion on township veterans' memorial

After more than a year, Grant Township's memorial to service people is almost done.

Dave and Penny Gaddis, owners of Hoopeston Monument, spent Tuesday and Wednesday working with the stencil listing 2,290 names of township residents who have served in the armed forces. When the stencil has been applied, the black Indian granite stones will be sandblasted, permanently etching the names in the stone. Six large stones will list the names of residents who

served in the armed forces. A separate stone, approximately the size of a grave monument, will list the names of those who were killed in action, said Dave Gaddis. That stone will be placed in front of the others.

Names for the monument were collected by a group made up of representatives of the Hoopeston AMVETS, American Legion and VFW posts. Gaddis helped the committee select the stones and Silver Brothers helped set the stones in the southwest corner of the park.

Barring bad weather, Gaddis hopes to have the stenciling and sandblasting completed by Friday, in time for Veterans' Day.

No services are scheduled at the monument; however the Hoopeston American Legion will have free chili and potato soup beginning at 11 a.m. and the Hoopeston VFW will have free chili and hot dogs starting at 1 p.m., both on Monday.

adventure.

Young people will learn CPR, some police tactics and handling basic reports. Participants may then do some actual police work.

Some law enforcement related Explorer posts have uniforms and vehicles for participants and allow them to ride with officers. Whether that will happen locally is under consideration. "We're going to look at that very heavily," Drollinger said.

Officer Jeremy Welch, a former counselor at Lincoln's Challenge, will coordinate the local program. Drollinger also hopes to get the support of Troy Davis, a former Vermilion County sheriff's deputy who now teaches law enforcement courses at VOTEC.

In other news, Drollinger said the department has received a \$3,500 grant from the Illinois Department of Transportation to add a third in-car camera.

Cameras have become a beneficial part of police work. For example, since the cameras were installed, no suspect charged with driving under the influence of alcohol has requested a trial if the arrest was videotaped, Drollinger said.
