## Larry Lobb renamed Hoopeston Area board president

Familiar faces will lead the Hoopeston Area School Board for the next two years.

Incumbent board members—re-elected last April—were seated at Thursday's board meeting.

Larry Lobb was renamed board president and Jeff Stipp vice-president. Mike Pemberton was named secretary, replacing Steve Unger.

In related action, the board approved raising the secretary's annual salary from \$150 to \$200. Unger voted against the increase. He did not take a salary during his tenure as secretary.

In unrelated action, the board:

- held a public hearing on the \$2,624,824 tax levy. There was no public comment.

- approved applying for a per capita library grant. If approved, the district will receive 75 cents for each student, totaling about \$1,100, said Superintendent Mark Conolly.

- approved a policy allowing students with asthma to

self-medicate. Students are not allowed to carry medication; however the General Assembly ruled schools must let students with asthma carry their medication under certain guidelines, including that the parents must authorize self-medication, parents must provide a written statement from a doctor, physician's assistant or nurse practitioner containing the name and purpose of the medication, prescribed dose and the times or special circumstances when medication should be taken.

- is considering a policy prohibiting aggressive behavior. A rough draft was presented Thursday. A final draft will be voted on at the December meeting.

- learned Wednesday will be a school improvement day. The focus will be on writing. Vermilion County Sheriff's Department chief investigator Gary Miller will speak at the high school on school safety.

- learned the district's request for a physical education waiver will be heard by the General Assembly on Nov. 14.

## High school group mixes ingredients into recipe for caring

Take some flour, an egg or two and a few other ingredients, mix in some high school students and you have a recipe for a touch of home for area service people.

Approximately 25 members of Hoopeston Area High School's Students Against Alcohol and Drugs (SAAD) started a drive to collect cookies from Hoopeston residents to send to former HA students now serving in the military.

"SAAD likes to do community service things and we decided this was something we could do for them since they're putting their lives on the line for us," said group sponsor Rita Dean.

To make sure no one is left out, students are also collecting names and addresses of former graduates who

are now service people. Early this week, Dean had names for only five people. "I know we have more than that out there," she said.

Dean said she spoke with one of her student's mothers who said the cookies may take several days to get to New York before being shipped overseas so Dean recommended things like chocolate chip and sugar, or other kinds of cookies without perishable ingredients such as fruits.

More stringent inspections in New York may delay shipping as well. "I heard they were taking special precautions," Dean said. "Hopefully (our packages) will get through all right."
