Warm weather, economy force lay-offs at Schumacher plant

A warm winter and cheaper labor costs in Mexico will result in the loss of about 20 jobs at the Schumacher Electric plant in Hoopeston.

Employees in the transformer and material prep department of the battery charger plant will be laid off over the next one to four months, said plant manager Craig Lawson. The workers will join 40 laid off two weeks ago due to the economy and the weather, he said.

Laid off employees were all hourly workers. "We really don't have that many salaried people in the building now," Lawson said.

Those who have been or will be laid off may get assistance from the NAFTA and Trade Adjustment Assistance programs. Assistance may include job training and assistance, extended unemployment benefits and relocation, but it may take several weeks for the company to learn if it was approved

for the program, Lawson said.

Even if more traditional winter weather appears, Lawson does not expect many, if any, employees to be recalled. "It's a pretty seasonal business," he said.

Low battery charger sales have resulted in decreased production at the plant. With the work force available at the beginning of the year, Lawson said 7,000 units could be produced weekly. Production is currently less than half that amount. "We've been hit pretty hard here since the middle of December," he

Schumacher Electric has two manufacturing plants, in Hoopeston and in Mexico. The company has transitioned jobs to Mexico for about three years because of reduced labor costs, Lawson said.

Despite that, the plant will remain open, at least for now. "There are no plans (to close the plant) at this time," he said.
