

Slain men believed to be targets, not random victims: police

Police believe two men found slain Tuesday along a country road near Henning were targeted to be killed rather than random victims.

The men, Hispanic males of an undetermined age, were found lying along County Road 2900 North, approximately halfway between Henning Road and Rt. 1, said Gary Miller, Vermilion County Sheriff's Department Chief Investigator.

"We're sure they were the targeted victims of this crime," Miller said. "We don't think this was a random situation."

Police are still trying to determine the men's identities and where they came from. "At this point, we have to look in all directions," he said.
