Children are a special concern of county circuit judge

Judge Claudia Anderson has a soft spot for children but can be hard on kids who break the law.

Anderson, who serves on the bench in the Vermilion County Circuit Court, was the speaker at Monday's Hoopeston Police Department Neighborhood Watch program.

She was appointed to the bench in 1997 to replace Judge Rita Garman, who was appointed to the Appellate Court. Anderson has since been reelected and, during her tenure, has served on the juvenile and felony divisions, is currently serving a rotation on "the potpourri division" which hears varying cases, and in July returns to the juvenile division.

Beside having served as a judge over juveniles, Anderson is the mother of three girls and has a background in education. "Before I went to law school, I taught school," she said.

One of the biggest problems Anderson has

seen stems from the combination of young people and drugs, either using or selling. "Many are uneducated high school dropouts who plant to make their living dealing drugs," she said. "What I see are kids who are dropping out, typically in the ninth or 10th grade. These kids grow into adult offenders. They 'graduate' from juvenile to adult court," she said.

Sometimes, sending a young person to a juvenile facility serves as a deterrent later on. "To have to spend time in a juvenile facility can wake you up," she said. "If you catch them quick enough, sometimes that works."

Anderson believes drugs are a driving force behind much of the crime in Vermilion County. People commit other crimes, such as robbery, burglary and home invasion, to fund their drug habits. "It's a cycle," she said. "They steal to sell what they steal to buy drugs."

Two drugs are especially problematic, Anderson said. "The drug that I have the biggest concern for and the one that causes problems is co-



caine," she said, adding there are also more methamphetamine labs in the county.

"The hard part is remembering it until you get to court," she said. "Justice moves very slowly and that aggravates me."

While Anderson hands out sentences every day, she tries to do her best and let it go. "I'm the judge here on earth and in the Vermilion County courthouse and if I call it wrong, I'm counting on
