Hoopeston Area board approves retirement incentive plan

Some non-certified employees of Hoopeston Area schools will be able to get out of school early.

At a meeting Thursday, the district school board approved an early retirement incentive plan which, with contributions from the district and employee, will allow employees to "buy" an additional five years of service.

The incentive program is available to employees who are 50 and have at least 20 years' service, said Superintendent Mark Conolly.

Three employees qualify for the program but letters will be sent to all non-certified staff, he said.

The board also approved an amortization plan that will allow the district to make its contributions to the early retirement plan over five years.

In other action, the board approved student

fees for the 2002-03 year. Book rental was raised \$2 across the board but other fees will remain the same. They are:

Book rental: Early Childhood, \$22; kindergarten-sixth \$26; middle school, \$29; high school \$33.

Breakfast (Maple and Honeywell): .75 for paid, .40 for reduced.

Lunch: grade schools \$1.50 full price, .40 reduced; middle/high school \$1.60 full price, .40 reduced; adult \$2.

Milk: .15/carton for split session, .25/carton for elementary, middle/high school and adult.
