Area woman honored for 30 years with migrant program

Isabel Loreda is on her second generation of helping migrant students learn.

Loreda, a bilingual teacher's assistant with the Hoopeston Area School District's migrant program, was honored recently for 30 years of service to the Summer Migrant Program.

The award was given at the Lisle-Naperville Hilton during the annual Summer Migrant Conference.

Unfortunately, family illness kept Loreda away from the ceremony, but co-workers presented her with the engraved clock last week.

Loreda, who also works in the fall migrant program, started with the summer sessions in 1972, helping migrant students with English, math, science and writing. In the intervening years, she's seen many changes in the program, including school administrators and teachers.

But perhaps the biggest change has been in the way students are taught.

In the early years, each district had its own curriculum but now, thanks to the Smart Program, courses are coordinated, allowing students to have stability in their education as they travel from place to place.

Computers are another change in the migrant program. Some students have their own laptop computers to keep up with school work while they migrate.

It's not only the ABCs and 1-2-3s that students learn from Loreda. A migrant worker, too, she is familiar with what the children experience as they travel.

The Summer Migrant Program started June 24 and will run through Aug. 2.

Hoopeston Rock Service offers products for drives, landscaping

Rich Stipp can rock your world.

Well, maybe not your entire world, but he can rock your driveway or your flower beds.

Stipp recently opened Hoopeston Rock Service, which offers rock, road pack, sand, pea gravel and landscape rock.

Varios rock sizes have differing uses. For example, road pack and ¾-inch rock are most commonly used in driveways. Road pack, which includes ¾-inch rock, smaller rock and fine rock material, hardens like a gravel road, Stipp said. The ¾-inch rock allows more drainage but as vehicles turn in,

the rock shifts.

Many equipment storage sheds use 1¼ inch and 2 inch rock, Stipp said. Large rock is also used when someone creates a driveway after removing sod. The larger rock forms a base on which road pack or ¾-inch rock is then applied.

Pea gravel and landscape rock are used for decorative purposes around trees and plants. Pea gravel is also used under playground equipment.

Delivery and spreading are also available. There is a delivery charge but spreading is included in that fee, Stipp said. Customers may also pick
