Hoopeston Area schools list 2002-03 student supplies

Hoopeston Area grade schools have listed supplies students will need for the 2002-03 year. They are:

C.A.R.E. - 1 pair Fiskars scissors, 1 box 8 crayons, 1 large bottle white glue, 3 glue sticks, 1 package washable markers, 1 box plastic sandwich bags, 1 box tissues, 1 book bag 9x12 or larger. **TMH** - school boxes, 2 boxes 8 large

crayons, 4 glue sticks, 1 box markers, 4 oz. bottle glue, 1 block eraser, 1 package/box colored pencils, gym shoes to

be left at school, 1 paint shirt, 1 book bag, 2 boxes tissues, complete change of clothes to be left at school.

Early Childhood -1 box 8 large crayons, 1 box tissues, 2 glue sticks, book bag big enough to hold a folder, complete change of clothes to be left at school.

Kindergarten -1 box 8 large Crayola crayons (first semester) 1 box 16 large Crayola crayons (second semester), 2 4 oz. bottles Elmer's white glue, 2 primary pencils (large type), paint shirt or apron, supply box (cigar or similar type), 2 large box tissues, tennis shoes for P.E. (to be left at school, no black bottoms) 8 white glue sticks, school bag without wheels, 1 pink or green eraser, change of clothes to be kept in child's locker.

Primary Special Ed – school box, 2 boxes 24 crayons, 8 glue sticks, 1 box markers, block eraser, scissors, 1 pkg. colored pencils, 2 pocket folders, gym shoes to be left at school, paint shirt, book bag, 2 boxes tissues, change of clothes to be left at school.

First grade – 2 pocket folders, 1 70-page wide-rule spiral notebook, 1 pkg. pencils, 2 pink block erasers, 1 box each 8 and 16 crayons, 8 oz. bottle white paper glue, 1 glue sticks, child's scissors (metal), 1 box tissues, pencil box, paint shirt, white-soled gym shoes to be left

at school, school bag, complete change of clothes to be left at school.

Second grade – 4 Ross solid glue sticks, 8 oz. bottle Elmer's white paper glue, 2 pink block erasers, 1 box 24 crayons, child's scissors (Fiskars, metal blades, dull tip, plastic handles) 2 pocket folders 1 or 2 boxes tissues, 1 pkg. long colored pencils, pencil box, white-soled gym shoes to be left at school, paint shirt, 1 pkg. of 8 widetipped markers, 1 pack #2 yellow pen-

cils, 2 spiral non-perforated wide-ruled notebooks.

Third grade -2 glue sticks, gym shoes for inside use, 4 1-gallon freezer Ziplock bags, pain shirt, 4 pocket folders (no prongs, solid colors only), 1 box tissues, scissors (Fiskars preferred) 2 pink block erasers, 6 #2 pencils, crayons (24 or fewer) washable markers, extra red-lead pencil, colored pencils, 4 oz. bottle white glue, 1 package wide-lined notebook paper. No Trapper Keepers. For homes use, subtraction and addition flash cards are recommended for first semester; multiplication flash cards for second semester.

Supplies for students in the above grades should be marked with the child's name.

Fourth grade – 8 oz. bottle glue, 2 glue sticks, pink block eraser, 5 #2 pencils, crayons, gym shoes for inside use only, school box, paint shirt, watercolor markers, 1 boxes tissues, wide-ruled white single sheet notebook paper (no spiral or college-rule), pointed scissors, large box colored pencils, 2 extra red-lead pencils, 3 pocket folders, 2 red pens, 1 3 ring binder notebook (rings at least 2" w/subject dividers), 2 1-gallon size freezer Ziploc bags. No spiral notebooks, pencil or supply boxes.
