Hospital CEO explains need for additional ambulance tax

Without financial help through city taxes, the heart of Hoopeston's ambulance service may flatline.

The Hoopeston City Council on Tuesday discussed a request from Frank Caruso, CEO of Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital, to raise the ambulance tax levy from its current level of .137 to the maximum .25. Alderman Bill Goodwine said at the meeting that the requested increase would raise the amount generated from \$41,000 to \$77,000.

Currently, tax money is placed in a restricted fund to purchase new ambulances, Caruso said. The city only pays the vehicle insurance of \$400 per month, he added.

In the past nine months, the ambulance services has grossed \$275,000 in revenue. Of that, 43 percent, or

HA year-end finances good

Hoopeston Area ended the fiscal year in good shape, with nearly \$1 million in the education fund.

"We're in very good shape going into the 03 fiscal year," said Superintendent Mark Conolly at Thursday's school board meeting.

The school received \$480,000 in state aid payments for June and July after the state board of education borrowed \$1 billion to pay expenses, he said.

Going into the new fiscal year, the district has consolidated seven teaching positions but has not eliminated any classes, Conolly said. However, that savings will be offset somewhat by the new teachers' contract currently being negotiated.

Conolly and business director Don Dean will begin working on the 02-03 budget, which will be on display Sept. 1. Conolly expects that like its predecessors, it will be a "worst case scenario" budget. "You want the good news at the end of the year, not necessarily at the beginning," he said.

\$118,000, was written off in what Medicare, Medicaid, self-pay and commercial insurances did not pay. Of the remainder, nearly \$200,000 went for salaries, FICA and supplies, and approximately \$10,000 went for diesel, repairs and utilities, leaving a deficit of about \$52,000 for the nine-month period, Caruso said. The estimated loss for the year is \$70,000. "We can't keep taking a \$70,000 hit," he said. "It's the difference between a positive and negative bottom line."

The higher tax would add about \$48 to the owner of a home with an assessed valuation of \$40,000, Caruso said. "One life saved in this community is worth that extra cost," he said. "I would wager that the vast majority of Hoopeston spends more than \$48 a month on cable TV bills."

Caruso said he knows first-hand the value of the ser-

Charles Burrows, 41, of Danville, was allegedly driving the car. He was charged with leaving the scene of a property damage accident and obstruction of justice.

vice. Last April, Caruso was returning to Hoopeston when he was the first to arrive on the scene where a woman pedestrian had been hit by a car on Rt. 9 in Rankin. Caruso said he went to the Casey's General Store to have employees call 911, then returned to the woman, who was lying in a ditch. After covering her in blankets from his truck, "I sat on my knees praying over that woman for 20 minutes," he said. "I never let go of that woman's hand. As he saw the ambulance approaching, "I literally thought to myself 'Thank God, it's all right now.""

Two Hoopeston Ambulance Service paramedics and an emergency medical technician responded to the call and, within five minutes, had the woman in the ambulance and headed to Carle Foundation Hospital. "I witnessed them save that woman's life," he said. "She should not be alive today. You ask that woman's family if it's not worth an additional 12 cents per \$100."

Caruso hopes others who have used the service will lobby their aldermen to pass the tax increase, allowing Hoopeston to keep its ambulance service and the people who work for it. "They're some of the most dedicated professionals I have ever worked with in my life," he said. "They would do anything to help the community.

"Let's retain a key component of the quality of life in this community," he said.
