Local people to 'Light the Night' for leukemia, lymphoma

Some local people are walking to raise a cure for a disease that has touched their family.

Leona York and Brenda Gaither of Hoopeston and Ray Eells of Rossville will go to Louisville, KY on September 21 to take part in "Light the Night," a walk to benefit the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, which fights blood-related cancers.

The walk, as well as the disease, strike home for the three. York's grandson, Jordan, son of former Hoopeston residents Don and Nancy York, was diagnosed with Acute Pro-Myelogenous Leukemia shortly after his 15th birthday.

What appeared to be a sinus headache did not respond to treatment, and instead turned into "excruciating headaches," York said. At first doctors thought Jordan had the childhood type of the disease but later discovered it was the adult kind. He underwent extreme chemotherapy at Kosair Children's Hospital in Louisville. The first year of treatment, Jordan skipped playing soccer. The

second year, he not only played soccer but joined the swim team. Cancer treatment did not deter him from other activities. "I pretty much just blew it off other than when I was in the hospital," he said.

Jordan has finished chemotherapy and is looking at a bright future.

A second cousin was less fortunate. Billy Lucas, son of Joyce Allen, was diagnosed with leukemia more than 20 years ago. He died of the disease when he was 10. When Jordan was diagnosed, it was a painful reminder of what leukemia can do and what the family lost, York said.

York credits increased information as the key to saving her grandson. "I'm just thankful they've come as far as they have in research in that area," she said.

Dollars drive that research and events like "Light the Night" help raise the necessary money. Jordan was part of a team last year that raised about \$2,000.

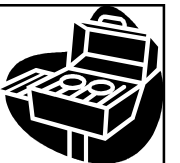


