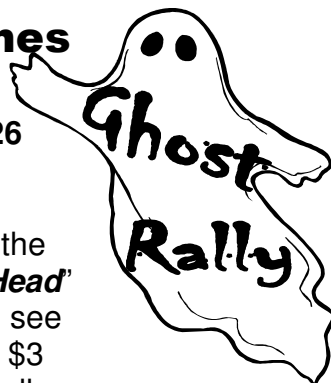

County Health Department schedules 2002 flu shot clinics

The Vermilion County Health Department has set tentative dates for influenza clinics in October and November.

Whether all the clinics will be held depends on if all flu vaccine ordered arrives. Last week, 1,600 of 6,000 doses had arrived.

County residents are asked to comply with Centers for Disease Control guidelines which encourage those most at risk to get immunized early, before others. Those considered at risk include anyone 65 or older, those with chronic illnesses including heart or kidney diseases, asthma, diabetes, cancer, HIV/AIDS and caregivers. Parents of infants and women who are or will be pregnant are asked to see their healthcare providers for immunizations. Healthy people age 64 or younger are asked to wait until November to be immunized.
