## Peace Corps Fellow considered by Visioning Committee

Hoopeston's Visioning for the Future committee is considering a Western Illinois University program to boost economic development.

The committee met Wednesday with Nigel Austin and Michelle Pride of the University of Illinois Extension program.

Although Austin and Pride are affiliated with the U of I, they have worked with communities considering the WIU Fellows program.

The 11-month program uses Fellows, students who are working on their Master's degrees and who have a minimum of two years' overseas experience with the Peace Corps, to work with communities in areas such as business, economics, public administration, recreation, regional planning and community health and health services management. Communities complete applica-

tions listing their needs and strategic plans and that information is paired with Fellows who have strengths in those areas.

To participate in the Fellows program, the Visioning Committee must include a sponsorship fee of \$20,000 and complete an application including local needs and letters of support. If the application is accepted, the group must also pay for things such as office rent, utilities and supplies.

Committee members, representing various aspects of the community, hope to pool resources within the community to pay costs associated with the program since improved economic development will benefit the entire area.

Since the Fellows program was started in 1994, about 50 communities, including Watseka, have participated.
