Hoopeston Area schools sets parent-teacher conferences

Hoopeston Area schools will hold parent-teacher conferences on Thursday, Oct. 24 and Friday, Oct. 25.

Thursday conferences will be held from 4-7 p.m. On Friday, parents may meet with teachers from 8 a.m. to noon.

Parents of students in kindergarten through sixth grade need to make an appointment with their child's teacher to insure the time available for their conference.

Parents of older students are urged to make appointments but conferences can be handled without making appointments.

Parents or guardians who cannot arrange their schedule to attend a conference during the set hours are asked to call their child's school to arrange an alternate time to meet with teachers.

No grade reports will be sent home with any student. They must be picked up by parents at their child's attendance center during the above times. This applies to all students.

Students will be dismissed early on Oct. 24. Grades kindergarten through six will be dismissed at 2:05 p.m. followed by grades 7-12 at 2:20 p.m.

There will be no school Oct. 25.

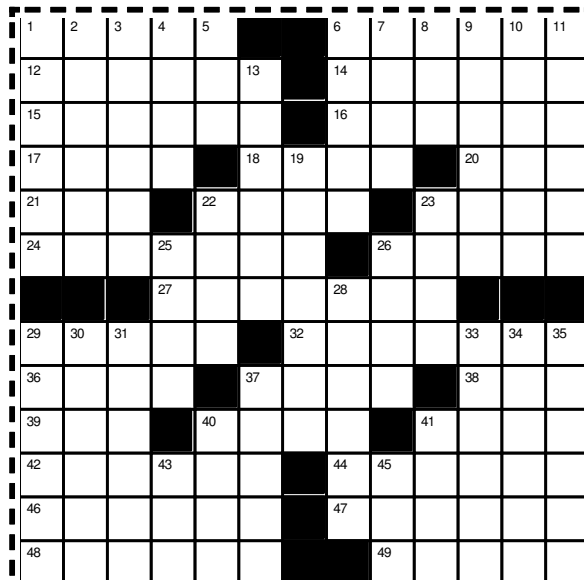
