### Retired judge, former Hoopeston mayor, Joseph Moore dies

Retired mayor and former Hoopeston mayor Joseph C. Moore, 74, died at 4:56 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 15, 2002 at Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital.

Mr. Moore was born June 1, 1928 in Kansas City, MO., the son of Dr. J.C. and Mabell Cater Moore. He married Marilyn M. Janzen April 4, 1953 in Mobile AL. She survives, along with two daughters, one son, six grandchildren, one sister and a niece.

Mr. Moore received his BA degree in 1950 and his Juris Doctorate Degree in 1952, both from the University of Missouri. He served as mayor from 1961-65 and was past president of many organizations, including Hubbard Trail Country Club, Hoopeston Rotary and E&I Club f Hoopeston.

He was a past president of the Vermilion County

Bar Association and a member of the Illinois Bar Association, American Bar Association, Missouri Bar Association and Illinois Judges Association.

He was a past member of the Danville Rotary Club and Hoopeston Jaycees, serving as their Queens' Chairman for four years.

Funeral services for Mr. Moore will be at 2 p.m. Saturday at the First Presbyterian Church, 915 E. Orange, Hoopeston. Burial will be in Floral Hill Cemetery. Visitation will be noon to 2 p.m. Saturday at the church.

Memorials are suggested to the First Presbyterian Church of Hoopeston, the Hoopeston Public Library or Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital.
