



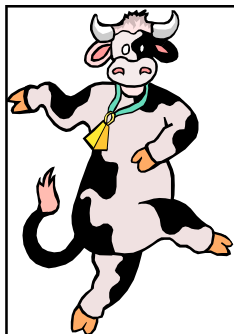

Healthcare center to participate in WIU Mapping program

Hoopeston will decide the overall health of its community as part of a project underway at Hoopeston Regional Healthcare Center.

The center is doing Mapping the Future of Healthcare with the Illinois Institute for Rural Affairs at Western Illinois University.

A kickoff meeting for the program was held last Thursday with approximately 20 residents, along with Mary Jane Clark, RN, health Mapping program director; Nancy Richman, PhD., manager of the community Mapping program; and Jessie Kaskie, Clark's assistant.

Through several sessions, the Mapping program will outline community needs, not only in healthcare but for other areas that ensure a healthy community, Clark said. The Mapping committee will examine data on health education, healthcare services and environmental health but will also include the economy, housing, recreation and other areas.

From the kickoff meeting, members move on to an eight-hour session Nov. 1 in which they will look at

where Hoopeston currently is and where it wants to go. "We want you to dream big," Clark said.

The group will then meet for four hours on Nov. 22 to decide how to achieve goals and again Dec. 13 to plan ways to make those goals reality.

The basic Mapping process takes 16 hours, Clark said, but that does not include a town meeting which will be scheduled or time spent in action committees to accomplish goals.

Clark said Mapping staff will assist the committee in making and reaching goals but that it is the community that must do much of the work. "It's geared towards communities that want to take charge," she said.

Richman concurred, saying the plan approved by the community committee "is designed to be implemented, it's not designed to sit on a shelf."

Even after the project is completed and goals reached, the Mapping staff will keep in touch with the community for surveys and updates, Richman said.
