

New state rep talks politics at Neighborhood Watch meeting

As a resident of a farming community and a small business owner, Shane Cultra knows the conditions facing Vermilion County residents and he's taking that knowledge to Springfield.

Cultra, 52, of Onarga, ran unopposed to be state representative of the 105th District. He spoke at the Hoopeston Neighborhood Watch meeting Monday.

The 105th District includes all or parts of Vermilion, Iroquois, Champaign, Livingston, Ford and McLean counties.

Hoopeston is the largest city in the mostly-Republican district, which stretches from Savoy to Dwight and Chenoa to the Indiana border.

Cultra had no competition for the **eston Neighborhoo** seat either in the primary or the general election. Running unopposed was "a very large blessing for me," he said.

A fifth-generation Onargan, Cultra's family has owned Onarga Nursery since after the Civil War. Cultra began working in the business when he was approximately eight years old, pulling weeds. "I'm kind of look-

ing forward to doing something else," he said.

Cultra also served for 14 years on the Iroquois County Board and as board president for two years.

Cultra believes his experiences make him qualified to represent the district. "I am who I am because of my association and interaction with the people of this area," he aid. "You're sending your father to Springfield or your son or your brother because I'm one of you."

In Springfield, Cultra plans to work to bring new businesses and industry to the district. He would also like to revamp property taxes and eliminate inheritance taxes in the state

afloat is "an unfair burden" to property owners, he said, adding many people lose their property because they cannot pay increasing taxes. "You think you own your land," he said, "you don't. You just rent it."

Cultra called the inheritance tax "the worst tax that was ever conceived," and said it is unfair for land owners and business owners to be taxed after death.
