Incumbents retained in county, many state, national races

There were few surprises in county voting Tuesday as many incumbents were re-elected and others running unopposed.

At the county level, all incumbents were re-elected, including County Clerk Lynn Foster, Treasurer Sue Stine, Sheriff Pat Hartshorn, Regional Superintendent of Schools Jim Trask and Supervisor of Assessments Donald Crist.

Three incumbents will return to represent District 1 on the Vermilion County Board. Mark Drollinger, Gary Weinard and Chris Leigh were all re-elected, with tallies of 2,036, 1769 and 1,710, respectively.

In the race for Board of Review 2, Hoopeston resident Bob Ault, a Democrat, was defeated by Gene Frerichs, 5,460 to 4,090.

In Congressional races, Republican Shane Cultra ran unopposed for the 105th district and Republican Dan Rutherford, also running unopposed, will represent the 53rd District.

Bill Black, who has represented this area for years, easily defeated challenger Charlie Mattis to represent the 104th District.

Illinois Supreme Court Justice Rita Garman held her position, defeating Democrat challenger Sue Myer-

scough and in the Fifth Judicial Circuit, Judge C. Steve Ferguson defeated GOP challenger Mitch Schick. Judges Ashton Waller, Tracy Resch and Dale Cini were all retained.

In Iroquois County races, incumbent Mark Henrichs defeated Democrat Joe Mathy for county clerk and Republican Eldon Sprau defeated acting Sheriff Robert Harwood. David Perzee ran unopposed for treasurer.

In state offices, Democrats Rod Blagojevich and Pat Quinn will be Illinois' new governor and lieutenant governor, respectively. They defeated Republicans Jim Ryan and Carl Hawkinson.

Lisa Madigan will be the state's new Attorney General.

Other officers were re-elected, including Jesse White, secretary of state; Dan Hynes, comptroller and Judy Baar Topinka, treasurer.

In federal contests, Tim Johnson will continue to represent the 15th Congressional District, defeating Democrat Joshua Hartke and Green Party candidate Carl Estabrook.

U.S. Sen. Dick Durbin was handily re-elected over Republican Jim Durkin and Libertarian Steve Burgauer.

All results were unofficial at press time.
