Florida financial institution takes vest-ed interest in K-9

A Florida credit union has taken a vested interest in Hoopeston's K-9 officer.

Employees of the City County Credit Union in Ft. Lauderdale held a fundraiser to pay for a bulletproof vest for K-9 officer Maggie, partner of Office Ephriam

Interest at the financial institution started when Bolin's uncle. Doug, talked about his nephew and Maggie to colleague Erika Sanchez. "She's a huge animal lover," Bolin said.

Sanchez wondered whether Maggie had a vest and, after learning she did not, set about getting her one.

Sanchez and Doug Bolin raised more than \$300 toward the \$495 purchase prize.

The remaining cost, at first to be paid by a California group whose mission is vests for police dogs. Bolin.

The vest, from International vest. Armor Corporation of Oceanside,

Calif., comes in three pieces and is made of Kevlar covered in nylon. Velcro and elastic straps keep it securely protecting Maggie's back, chest and underbelly. Bolin can have Maggie fully dressed in less than a minute.

Unlike her human counterpart, Maggie will not wear her vest at all times. "I'll put it on her for hostile situations" or in situations that might be dangerous, Bolin said. For example, he said, Maggie will wear her vest for building searches. The vest will be with Bolin and Maggie in their squad car at all times, he said.

Literature on the vest says it is not a hindrance to the dog, but Maggie, still not used to it, changes her stride to accommodate it. "She still doesn't like it too much," Bolin said.

Vermilion County restaurants to begin posting food service inspection scores in new year

Beginning next year, Vermilion County restaurants will be required to post scores from their most recent food service inspections. The Vermilion County Board approved the new requirement last July.

Beginning Jan. 1, letter scores will be posted along with permits, said environmental health director Kolby Riggle. County inspections are scored on a 100-point form. Restaurants receiving 90-100 will get an A; B scores will be 80-89; C will be 70-79.

Restaurants scoring less than 70 will be closed until they cored the cited violations.

Posting scores is expected to make restaurant owners

and managers strive to meet department standards. A similar system used in Los Angeles, Calif., restaurants showed only 52 percent of restaurants making a A in 2000 but the number jumped to 83 percent in 2001, Riggle said.

Increased permit fees will also go into effect Jan. 1. High risk restaurants, such as full service eateries preparing food from raw ingredients, will pay \$175, up from \$100. Moderate risk establishments will pay \$125, up from \$75; low risk restaurants will pay \$75, up from \$50


