Website designed to promote Hoopeston job growth is up

A website designed to create jobs in Hoopeston is now on the Internet.

The site, at www.cityofhoopeston.org, was activated last week, said Robert Davis.

Davis, of CDA Marketing, Watseka, was paid \$14,500 by the city to create the website, which is designed to draw attention to available commercial buildings and land in Hoopeston. Davis' fee was paid with tax increment financing (TIF) money.

The site is positioned using key word ranking in categories such as "commercial land for sale", "commercial property Illinois" and "business building for sale." It is among the top three rankings for sponsored matches of 16 phrases, Davis said. "That's a pretty significant accomplishment in just eight days," he said. "We're out there."

One way word of the site is spreading is through links with other Hoopeston sites. Davis has requested links from such places as the Hoopeston Public Library and school district. However, the city page will not reciprocate with links to other sites because it is a non-profit economic development site.

Alderman Bill Goodwine, who oversaw the project from the city's perspective, said the intent was not to provide an all-encompassing city web page. "The reason we hired (Davis) was basically to make a job creation program," he said. "If we wanted to make a city web site, we would've used someone local, although I have no problem if it grows into that."

The site lists available properties and highlights Hoopeston's strengths, such as the hospital, school system and available work force. Each area is positive because Davis said research shows that perceptions of a city, not the reality, matter most. The site showcases an "extremely pro-business city council doing what it can to improve the outside perception of Hoopeston," he said. "Hopefully it will stir momentum and help the city over the next few years."

Davis presented his initial proposal to the city council in February 2002. He signed a contract Sept. 17, saying the site would be online in 12 weeks but Davis extended the deadline to meet with more groups and get a clearer picture of the community. "I wanted to give personal attention to the town, meet more people, get my finger on the pulse of the community," he said.

Davis agreed to oversee the site and respond to queries for three years, but he and Goodwine see the relationship lasting longer.

"So many people expressed dissatisfaction that the city couldn't handle the leads generated," Davis said. "People said not a single member of the council could field queries." To solve that, Davis said he will monitor the site for longer than three years.

Goodwine agreed that Davis may handle that aspect for some time to come - without additional city funds.

Davis negotiated finders fees with owners, to be paid if property sells because of the site. "Hopefully, the finders fee will be enough to keep him interested," Goodwine said, adding he is impressed with the site because of its upbeat attitude. "It certainly puts Hoopeston's best side forward," he said.

Whether the site will accomplish it's purpose will take time to determine. "There's only one measurement and that's jobs," Goodwine said.

In discussing a website last year, Goodwine expressed doubts that it would prove the city's salvation, an attitude he still holds. "I thought then that there was less than a 50 percent chance of it working," he said. "I remain hopeful but no more optimistic than I originally was."

Senior Citizens Assessment Freeze Exemption Notice

The Danville Supervisor of Assessments office will be mailing out the Senior Citizen Assessment Freeze Exemption forms for 2003 sometime in January or early February. You must be 65 years of age and have a wholehousehold income of \$40,000.00 a year or less to qualify for this exemption. If you have filed for this exemption in the past, you should receive one in the mail.

If you do not receive a copy in the mail by the middle of February, or if you have not signed up for this exemption in the past and think you might qualify, contact the Grant Township Assessor's office at 283-6868. The filing deadline for this exemption is July 1, 2003.
