



Hoopeston hospital halts construction pending investigation

Construction on a \$1.2 million expansion/renovation project at Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital has been halted pending a criminal investigation.

In a statement issued Monday, Russ Leigh, Hoopeston Regional Healthcare Center board chairman, said construction will not begin again until an inspection by a construction specialist and an engineer. Their reports will determine when and how construction resumes, the release said.

According to the statement, the board began receiving reports several months ago about the appropriateness of expenditures and the quality of construction. Billings were studied, site inspections increased, a private investigator hired and the general contractor and architect firm's representatives were questioned.

Those findings were turned over to Gary Miller, Vermilion County Sheriff's Department chief investigator, to determine if any improprieties were criminal. "We were contacted about questionable expenditures," Miller said Tuesday, adding the investigation is still in the preliminary stages. "These types of investigations are never quick due to the amount of paperwork involved," he said.

The matter was taken before a grand jury which issued subpoenas for documentation to do with the building, specifications and renovations. "The documentation shows questionable expenses that need to be explained," Miller said.

A grand jury may also be used to determine whether criminal activity took place. Once Miller completes the investigation, the findings will be turned over to the state's attorney's office which may take findings to the grand jury, bring criminal charges or determine there is not enough evidence to bring charges.

Stratum, Inc. of St. Louis is the project contractor. Some work is being done by local subcontractors, including Hoopeston Electric, Ervin Construction and Shields Painting. Asked whether local companies appear to be involved in improprieties, Miller said "at this point,

The statement praised the health center staff. "The board greatly appreciates their loyalty and the patience of the community as we work our way through this corrective process," the statement said.


