Early morning blaze destroys Stokely warehouse building

Six fire departments fought a fire early Wednesday morning at the Hoopeston Stokely plant on First Ave. Hoopeston firemen responded to the call at about 12:15 a.m., said fire chief Greg Shipman. Smoke was coming from a warehouse but the exact location of the

fire was not known until fire broke through the roof, he said.

Shipman called for mutual aid from several departments, including the Danville for its aerial truck, Rossville, Wellington-Greer, Rankin and Milford. Firemen were on the scene for more than four hours knocking down the fire and were called back shortly before 9 a.m. and again at 1:30 p.m. for flare-ups.

The fire was fed by contents of the 40,000 square foot warehouse, which included new cardboard boxes and chip board divider sheets used between bright-stacked cans, said facility manager Drew Allen. The building See STOKELY on other side



also contained the warehouse and shipping offices and labeling lines from the old Stokely plant, he said.

The fire is being investigated by the Illinois State Fire Marshall's office. A cause was not immediately available.

Firemen pulled so much water from the city water system that a water main on Bank St. broke. Water department workers were called out in the early morning hours and spent Wednesday looking for leaks and repairing the main.

Although an exact figure was not available, firemen used more than 500,000 gallons of water fighting the fire, said water superintendent Steve Baker. An extra valve was opened to allow firemen to pump enough water. Early Wednesday, city water had been treated but not filtered for rust content because of the volume used to fight the fire.

The aerial truck alone pumped 1,200 gallons per minute, Shipman said.

A damage estimate on the building was not available but Allen said it was one of the plant's original buildings, constructed in the late 1800s. It was not damaged in an explosion and fire at the main building in September 1992, he said.

Allen praised the fire department for its quick work. "They did a good job of containing it," he said. "Except for a little smoke smell, the rest of the buildings came out unscathed."


Allen said he does not expect the fire to hamper efforts to sell the plant, which was purchased in 1997 by Friday Canning, a subsidiary of Chiquita Brands International.

The plant, in which canning had gone on since the 1870s, was closed in January 1998.
