Officials of the school plan to open their internetbased school in the former Grant Township building at 200 E. Penn, said director Ed Hubbard.

The sale is expected to close July 7 and the transfer of school property from Chicago is expected to begin shortly after.

The school is being promoted on the internet at www.witchschool.com to attract on-line students. Tuition from those students will help pay for the building.

Hubbard and other school officials chose Hoopeston as the site for the school because of its proximity to Chicago, St. Louis and Indianapolis. Also, several of the school's approximate 60,000 students are from the Danville area, and because more space was needed to store business-related items, he said.

It was the recent addition of high speed internet that attracted school officials to Hoopeston. With that available, 'we'll build nice 21st century systems for us to work on," he said.

Along with teaching Wicca, Hubbard said the business will also offer classes in buying and selling on E-Bay and other topics. "One of the things we're teaching is real world sciences," he said.
