Hoopeston Area school board to discuss possible R-A co-op

Hoopeston Area residents concerned about what could happen if the district forms a co-op high school with Rossville-Alvin will be able to get information at Thursday's HA board meeting.

The board is expected to discuss Monday's Rossville-Alvin meeting where that board did not approve a cooperative high school agreement with Bismarck-Henning. The decision leaves the door open for a possible union between Rossville-Alvin and Hoopeston.

What a co-op high school will mean for either district has not been decided and will not be unless further talks are held between the two districts, said HA Superintendent Mark Conolly on Wednesday. "We don't know when and if talks will continue," he said.

Whether Hoopeston Area will lose its mascot, the Jerky, school colors or anything else in a possible coop "is pure speculation," he said. "It's premature to draw conclusions. All that is so far down the road, it's hard to comment."

Conolly said that if talks between the districts continue, it will be important to keep all options open. "Everything is open for discussion," he said. "It has to be to have an open dialog."


