Accepting building put on hold until contract available

Hoopeston's Willdon Building still does not have a new owner.

City officials expected to vote on whether to accept the building as a gift from Capstone Bank at Tuesday's council meeting. However, Mayor Chalmers Flint said a contract was not available for viewing prior to the meeting.

The council will vote on whether to accept the building, with plans to sell it for \$1 to Tad Ballantyne, an investor in Hoopeston Foods.

Flint said Ballantyne plans to invest

\$100,000 to \$200,000 in the building creating apartments of the third through fifth floors and is still considering uses for the first two floors.

In other business, the council:

approved spending \$3,500 for asbestos abatement at the former Baer's Motel. The money will be reimbursed from the TIF fund.

- learned stop signs will be placed at the southeast and northwest corners of North Eighth at Wyman. The street and alley committee will also consider a request to make the alley behind Monical's one-way from west to east.
- heard from Alderman Carl Ankenbrand that the city got its mosquito sprayer back and will spray in the area of the fireworks before Friday night. Hoopeston Little League has also requested the area of their field be sprayed.
- approved RV parking in McFerren Park during the Farm Progress Show. The Hoopeston Visioning Committee had requested permission to use parking as a fundraiser.
- heard that certificates of appreciation were given to Sgt. Jim DeWitt and Officers Ephriam Bolin and Jeremy Welch from the Alliance Against Intoxicated Motorists. This is the first time an entire shift has been awarded, said police committee chairman Alderman Ed Lots. The three honored work third shift.
- learned the McFerren Park Civic Center will be closed to walkers July 13-19. New playground equipment will be stored in the building.
- heard from Alderwoman Nancy Stipp about the Trash Walkers, a volunteer clean-up program that meets from 9-10 a.m. Saturdays.
