Hoopeston Area district has 'worst case scenario' fiscal year

For many years, Hoopeston Area's annual budget has been prepared with the worst-case scenario in mind.

In 2003, the district experienced that scenario, according the district business director.

Last fiscal year, which ended June 30, the district's education fund - used for the bulk of school spending, including salaries, ran \$460,000 short, said Don Dean at Thursday's school board meeting.

The shortfall resulted primarily from receiving less income than expected, due to state cuts in reimbursement programs, having fewer students and low interest on investments, he said.

State aid payments in the last fiscal year were equivalent to the 1998 level, Dean said. Those payments make up almost half the district's education fund. "That's a long way to go back when most of your money comes from state aid," he said.

Hoopeston Area lost more money when its enrollment dropped. About 70 fewer students attended last year than the year before. The district has lost approximately 400 students in the last 10 years. Adding just 100 students would add about \$500,000 per year in state aid, Dean said.

The loss would have been greater had the district not used \$300,000 of one-time Charlotte Ann Russell Trust money, Dean said. "We always said 'we'll save it for someday when we need it," Dean said. "Well, someday came in 2003."

While revenues dropped, budgeted expenses for the fiscal year exceeded estimates by only \$52,000, an increase of only half of one percent.

Dean does not expect the financial picture to improve. "It's not going to get any easier over the next few years," he said. "We finished as good as we could finish."

Dean said Hoopeston Area will not request a tax hike

for next year. The district's working cash fund of approximately \$887,000, will cover deficits for 2003-04.

In other action, the board approved a resolution to formally initiate discussion with Rossville-Alvin on a cooperative high school or any other type of appropriate reorganization.

The resolution calls for discussion on using both districts' facilities, name changes, color and mascot changes and appropriate equality of representation on a governing board.

The resolution also indicates the board's interest in promoting a reorganization feasibility study and its willingness to pay the expense of the study.

Dr. William Phillips, a consolidation consultant, spoke separately to the Hoopeston Area and Rossville-Alvin boards on July 1. He said feasibility study would cost about \$10,000 but that state incentives would pay all but about \$2,000 of the cost.

The resolution, which passed unanimously, was to be sent to Rossville-Alvin prior to that board's meeting Monday night.

The Rossville-Alvin board voted down a co-op high school with Bismarck-Henning, 4-3. Since then, R-A requested a co-op with Bismarck for girls basketball. "I told (R-A board president) Dennis (Price) we'd be happy to take it if Bismarck-Henning won't," said HA board president Larry Lobb.

One-day applications taken for summer energy assistance

East Central Illinois Community Action Agency has received funding for energy assistance payments to help low-income households who have a member who is particularly at-risk from summer heat.

On Monday, July 21, the agency will accept applications for cooling assistance for households with a member 60 or over; those with at least one child age two or younger; and from households where a doctor certifies that a member has a disease or illness, such as heart disease or emphysema, that makes air conditioning necessary. A doctor's slip will be required.

No other households qualify for assistance.

Applications will be accepted from 7:30 a.m.-6:30 p.m. at the agency's administrative office at 56 N. Vermilion. Senior citizens may apply at CRIS Senior Services, 309 N. Franklin, from 8 a.m.-4 p.m.

Applicants who received heating assistance in the winter need only bring a doctor's slip if applicable, and will need to fill out a short application. Applicants who did not receive heating assistance in the past year must bring proof of income for the past 30 days; Social Security cards for all household members, power bills and a doctor's slip, if applicable.

Income guidelines are: \$1,108 for one person; \$1,493 for two people; \$1,878 for three; \$2,263 for four people; and \$385 per each additional person.

Qualifying households will receive a flat \$150 payment directly to their utility company. Households which are disconnected from electric service may receive an additional \$100 for reconnection.
