Hoopeston Police Department to have new firing range

The old Santa Claus house, a few old desks from the Hoopeston Area School District and lots and lots of dirt will soon give Hoopeston police officers a place to practice their marksmanship.

Those items and others are being used as parts of a new gun range for the department.

Located off Route 9, south of the Ameren-CIPS substation, the range is being built as a joint effort by many city departments, said Sgt. James Goodrum, firearms instructor and one of the department's range officers.

Nestled in the city limits on cityowned property, the range is positioned to allow officers to practice shooting safely. The range is more than a halfmile from Lover's Lane Road and nearly three quarters of a mile from the high/middle school. A 10-foot berm on the west side and 6-foot berm on the east have been joined by a manmade berm to the south, where the targets will be. The

22 feet high. The range will be primitive but functional. The Santa House will be

used to store targets and related items. The desks will be used on the firing line to hold extra ammunition and will be put in the building when not in use. An inverter will convert the power from a vehicle battery into an energy source for 50 watt 12 volt lights inside the building, a 150 watt floodlight for night shooting and for a public address system.

The location is close to Casey's General Store, so

> ice and soft drinks will be near, and close to Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital - just in case, Goodrum said. "This is perfect," he said.

of dirt to make the southward berm. The water and parks departments have also chipped in, mowing the site and burying posts to block the entrance to the range.

Others have donated time and effort to the project. As of last week, Goodrum had donated nearly 40 hours to the project "and I'm not done yet," he said. Having its own gun range will be an asset to the department, Goodrum said. The local range the department used to use closed about four years ago. Since then, officers have had to qualify at the Public Safety Building in Danville. "Getting all the officers and Auxiliary there at one time was next to impossible," he said. "We had to have a place to shoot."

Hoopeston officers have rarely had to shoot sus-

"We have to stay proficient and hit whatever we aim at," Goodrum said.

Police use .45 and .40 caliber and 9mm handguns and shotguns and will train with those at the range. Depending on their scores of a maximum 400 points, officers fall into four categories: Tyro for those shooting 70-74 percent; Marksman, in the 75-85 percent range; Sharpshooter, 86-92 percent; Expert, 93-96 percent; and Master, 97-100 percent. Officers shoot standing and kneeling and are timed on their shots.

Speed is essential for police shooting. "If it takes you 10 seconds, you possibly could be dead," Good-rum said.

All Hoopeston's officers are in the top three categories, he added.

Qualifying is done in daylight and at night and officers practice not only straight shooting, but also

firing around obstacles such as telephone poles and vehicles. Those barricades will also be added to the range.

The range will be available for other law enforcement agencies to use but will not be open to the public since it is illegal for anyone other than a police officer to fire a gun in the city limits.
