Ross-Al board hopes to expand scope of feasibility study

ROSSVILLE—The Rossville-Alvin School Board hopes to expand the scope of a proposed feasibility study on school reorganization.

At Monday's meeting, the board heard a resolution passed by the Hoopeston Area board last Thursday. The resolution in part indicated a strong interest in a feasibility study between the two districts.

Discussion on the resolution prompted board member Dale Lithgow to ask why the study could not be expanded to include the Bismarck-Henning and Armstrong-Potomac districts as well.

"Let's get a real good study so we have all the information in front of us when it comes time to make a decision," he said. "The more information we have, the better decision we can make."

Also, he added, since Rossville-Alvin currently has sports cooperative agreements with other districts, not asking them to take part in the study "would be an injustice."

And while Hoopeston's resolution said Hoopeston Area would be willing to pay for the study, board member Roger Satterwhite suggested Rossville-Alvin bear the cost. "I don't think we should have someone else pay for it," he said.

The feasibility study, expected to be done by consultant Dr. William Phillips, will cost about \$10,000. The state budget includes a line item to help districts pay up to \$7,500 for studies but that line item currently has no money in it. Rossville has requested to be on the list for when funds are available.

The study will include interviews with school boards, teachers, administration and residents in each of the affected districts, as well as information on buildings,

curriculum, transportation and other areas. From that information, a recommendation will be made on the type of reorganization and with whom Rossville-Alvin should merge.

The recommendation could be anything from Ross-ville-Alvin reorganizing with one district to a suggested northern Vermilion County high school. The latter possibility would be of little help to Rossville-Alvin which was involved in - and pulled out of - earlier talks about a high school district in the northern part of the county. "Then we're back to square one," he said.

Sartwell expressed concern about opening the study up to too many districts. For example, Armstrong-Potomac has dual districts - one for the grade schools and high school - which might complicate matters. "I'm just concerned we'll end up with a lot of different options and still have that one basic question - what's best?." he said.

Satterwhite said the board should move forward with the survey. "We need to make a decision," he said. "Other districts are waiting for us to make a decision."

School reorganization has become a divisive issue in the community, he said. "We all know this has been a very sensitive issue in our community," he said. "It's a sensitive issue among the board. We want to make the best decision for the kids, a decision that has the least impact on the community."

The board approved asking other districts to take part in the study. "We'll start with an invitation to other districts and see where that leads us," Sartwell said.

In unrelated action, the board reviewed finances for the fiscal year which ended June 30. The combined funds had revenues of \$3,003,330 and expenses of \$3,237,050 for a loss of \$233,720.

The district's education fund had the greatest loss, with \$2,270,561 in revenue and \$2,444,150 in expenses. Other shortages include the building fund, -\$32,094; bond and interest, -\$3,320; transportation, -\$74,006; IMRF, -\$1,519; and Life Safety, -\$2,353.

The deficits were caused by lower assessed property values, including that of the ConAgra plant, lower interest rates on investments, absent state aid payments and, in some cases, by programs for which the district has spent money but not has not yet been reimbursed.
