Rain most of Sunday and into Monday affected attendance which, in turn, affected sales of food and flea market items, she said. Sweet corn, normally gobbled up, lay unshucked Monday with few standing in line for the free food.

While McFerren Park will soon dry out, the effects of the wet festival will be felt in the community for several months. Proceeds from the event are used to fund other Jaycee programs, including underprivileged children's Christmas and the senior citizens
