2003 corn yield expected to break Illinois record high

SPRINGFIELD—Illinois corn for grain yield for 2003 is expected to be a record-breaking 169 bushes per acre, up 15 bushels from the Sept. 1 forecast, according to the Illinois Department of Agriculture.

"Farmers haven't had a harvest like this one since 1994, the year the previous record was set at 156 bushels, said ag department statistician Brad Schwab. "The increase in yield was the result of a much higher than expected grain weight. Mother Nature was extremely kind to farmers this year by providing cooler than normal temperatures and no major weather or pest factors

have occurred in the last month to hinder crop yields."

If expectations hold true, production would reach a record 1.87 billion bushels with this yield, 25 percent more than the corn produced in 2002, and five percent greater than the previous record production set in 1994.

Harvest is progressing well with many farmers waiting for the crop to dry down or switching to soybeans as they mature.

Thirty-two percent of the crop was harvested as of Oct. 5, compared to 33 percent last year at this time and the average of 42 percent.
