Community Fund gets nearly \$40,000 in funding requests

Eighteen agencies have requested nearly \$40,000 from the United Community Fund of Grant Township.

The Community Fund board learned of the requests at Wednesday's board meeting.

Three groups that had requested funds in other years - Headstart, Hoopeston T-Ball and YWCA Sexual Assault - did not request funds for 2004.

Groups which did request funds include Red Cross, Honeywell After School Program, Catholic Social Services, CRIS Senior Services, Cub Scouts, Grant Township Food Cupboard, Girl Scouts, Pony and Colt League and Ministerial Association.

Also, Girls Sports, Little League, Midget Football, Multi Agency, Community Center, Swim Team, Hoopeston Area Youth Club and John Greer After School

Program.

The Community Fund allocation meeting will meet Nov. 19 to review requests and make recommendations for funding based on contributions received.

The organization's fund drive is currently underway, with a goal of \$40,000. The annual street corner collection, held in August, raised about \$2,700. Other donations to date are: Hoopeston Area schools, \$4,547; professional, \$1,950; residential, \$315; rural, \$1,285; and retail, \$1,380 for a total of \$13,201.71.

Results for the industrial, financial, church, city and miscellaneous sectors are not yet in.

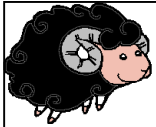

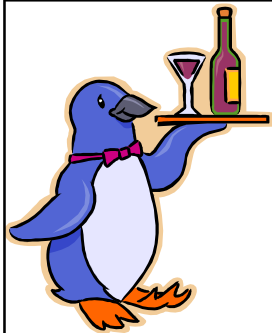
