Students, audience watches as teacher proposes at concert

Some men might like to propose in private...just in case. But not Javier Diaz, Hoopeston Area Middle/High School chorus teacher, who proposed to girlfriend Laura Dietsche in a very public way. Diaz popped the question at Thursday's Fall Concert.

It started at the end of the choral groups' pres-

entations, when Diaz said something not on the evening's program would be performed.

Students solemnly walked in the Hoopeston Area Middle School gym, each carrying a single red rose. In the center of the gym, an empty chair sat next to a small, cloth-covered table holding three glass vases. In turn, the students walked past the table, placing their flowers in the vases.

When the sea of students parted, Dietsche was sitting in the chair, tears streaming down her face, a tissue clutched tightly in her hand. Nearby, stood Diaz, smiling.

Walking to her and getting down on one knee, Diaz told Dietsche he had three questions to ask: would she accept the rose, would she be his buddy for life and finally, would she marry him. As he spoke, students unfurled a large banner that reiterated the final question.

Diaz held the microphone to Dietsche who simply said "yes."

The soft-spoken word resulted in loud applause and shouts from scores of choral students and the audience.

The couple has dated for four years. A wedding date was not announced at the concert.
