

TIF attorney to discuss TIF situation before Dec. 2 meeting

Hoopeston officials and residents can learn more about the city's tax increment financing (TIF) problem at a special meeting Dec. 2.

Bloomington attorney Tom Jacobs, the city's TIF attorney, will speak at 6 p.m., said Mayor Chalmers Flint at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Jacobs is expected to speak for about 45 minutes and will be followed by the regularly-scheduled council meeting.

Jacobs, along with city and county officials, met Nov. 5 in Danville to discuss overpayments made to the city of more than \$111,000. The meeting also included discussion on 152 parcels of land that were incorrectly included in the TIF district, another 35 that were omitted, 14 parcels that had not been annexed to the city and more, including Hoopeston Plaza, that had no base value listed.

At that meeting, officials opted to reduce the amount of Hoopeston's increment next year rather than have the city repay the money this year. Taxing bodies that had individual funds at maximum tax rates will receive reimbursements for tax money they should have received. The balance of the overpayment will be refunded to tax payers through somewhat lower tax rates.

In unrelated action, the council:

- approved purchasing a 2001 John Deere backhoe for the street/alley department. A 1973 backhoe will be traded in, with a value of \$9,500. Purchase price is \$43,750 from Martin Equipment in Tolono.
- amended an ordinance to allow the street superintendent or city council designee to name one-way streets and allevs in the city. Researching a request to make the alley behind Monical's one-way, city attorney William Nelson discovered the city did not have an ordinance covering who may designate roadways as one way.
- learned from Flint that values on former railroad property running east and west through the city may be available as soon as next week. The property, abandoned by the railroad and given to the city, will be

Rossville board approves zoning for new bed & breakfast

ROSSVILLE—A new bed and breakfast will be open soon in the village.

The village board on Monday following a zoning board recommendation and approved a special use permit for Terry and Sharon Prillaman to open a bed and breakfast at 409 S. Chicago.

The business, still in the planning stages, is not expected to open until spring, Mrs. Prillaman said in a telephone interview Tuesday.

In unrelated business, trustees:

approved a \$6,275.50 bid from Chris Craig of Mahomet for the villages' 1983 dump truck. Eleven bids were received for the truck.

- learned a program on drugs and methamphetamine will be held at 7 p.m. Nov. 24. The program is set to be held at the village office. However, if the crowd is large, it will be moved to one of the schools, said trustee Vic Lackey.
- approved paying half of a bill submitted by ERH Enterprises for vacuuming the storm sewer line. Officials said they were unaware the company, which oversees the village sanitary sewer system, was charging for its services. The total bill was \$1,185.57.
- approved the purchase of two taser guns for the police department at a cost of about \$1,600.
- learned the gas price will remain at 74 cents
