Illusionist brings magic, anti-drug message to area students

ROSSVILLE—Every day, some grade school student deals with peer pressure to do drugs.

Magician Tom Boz demonstrated that principle to about 350 fifth and sixth graders Tuesday at a special assembly at Rossville-Alvin High School.

Taking a boy from the audience, Boz played a specialized version of the game show "Let's Make A Deal."

Boz held up three envelopes marked A, B and C. He asked the youngster to choose one. "B" sure to pick," Boz said, as other students screamed letters from 'B' sure."

The boy chose envelope B.

demonstrating how students can be influenced to make choices. In this case, as in the decision to take drugs, it was a bad choice: envelopes A and C contained \$100 but B had a note that said the student got a big round of applause.

Boz told the students, from Rossville, Hoopeston, Bismarck, Potomac and Armstrong, that taking drugs hurts them on the inside, leaving scars that often, no one can see. Cutting a rope apart, then putting it back together, Boz told the children, "I want you to be whole."

Students clamored to respond when Boz asked why kids take drugs. Answers included rebelling against parents, peer pressure, curiosity and to get attention.

Boz told students the feeling of being high is like putting one's forehead on a baseball bat and turning in circles 50 times, doing it again, then running the length of the gym a few times. "Nobody tells you it makes you lightheaded and sick," he said.

He encouraged students to say no to drugs in five ways. First, he said, "say no like you mean it," he said. "You know that face parents and teachers have when you do something wrong," he asked, making a stern face. "I call that my parent/teacher 'no' face." He urged students to keep saying no, walk away and hang out with drug-free friends. His last method of saying no was
